


#### Mission and Identity

2. Decide what your characters can do. What abilities or powers could they have?


3. Choose something that makes them special. Think of the main events of the story and put them in order to make a plot.

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Children often have access to devices, including smartphones, from a very young age. Whether it's watching their favourite program through streaming services on your phone, using educational apps or simply viewing photos with you and the family - they are engaging with devices in one form or another.

#### But when is your child old enough to be given their own mobile phone?

The right age for your child will depend on their level of maturity. It's worth asking yourself the following questions before handing over a digital device:

- 1. Does my child have a good sense of responsibility?
- 2. Are they able to stick to the rules?
- 3. Do they show a good understanding of actions and consequences?
- 4. Do they come to me or another trusted adult when they are distressed or encounter problems?

For younger children it's best to start with a mobile phone without internet access and introduce a smartphone when they demonstrate an appropriate level of maturity. Some younger children might argue that they are ready for a smartphone, especially if their friends already have one, but it's worth holding out until you feel confident that your child is mature enough.

#### My child has their first smartphone - now what?

When your child receives their first smartphone, it's a great opportunity to instill safe online behaviours early on, so that they can carry these skills through to their teens and beyond.

#### Some ideas for rules:

- 1. No phones after a certain time (ie; 8.00 p.m.) unless in an emergency
- 2. Keep to daily screen time limits (ie; 1 hour per school night)
- 3. Family time is a no-phone zone (ie; dinner)
- 4. No not share your passwords with others apart from parents
- 5. Do not take or share photos of others (including friends) without their permission
- 6. Tell a parent or another trusted adult if anything makes you feel uncomfortable or if a stranger contacts you online
- 7. Do not purchase or download an app or game without talking to a parent first especially as these often have minimum age requirements.
- 8. Do not share your real name (or full name), age and address when posting, talking to strangers or on sites where anyone can see it.
- 9. Be kind to people treat people on the phone as you would face-to-face.




### Parent User Guide - Sentral Academic Reports


The Sentral Parent Portal provides online access for parents to a range of information specific to their child including their timetable, attendance records, the College calendar and reporting. This guide outlines the steps needed to access the student reports.

#### **New Users**

- 1. Open your browser (e.g. Chrome/ Firefox/Internet Explorer) and go to <a href="https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal/register">https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal/register</a>
- 2. Use your email address as a username and fill in the other required details to create your account.




3. You will then see a screen which looks like the one below – wait for your approval email from the school. This may take 24-48 hours.






4. Once you have received the email confirming your registration, use your web browser again and go to <a href="https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal">https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal</a> Log in using the username and password you created earlier.




5. You will then be prompted to add your child to your account by entering an Access Key. This Access Key was provided in both letters sent to you during this Semester and consists of letters and numbers e.g. **JZZ45m22jF.** Your child's photo will appear when you have successfully linked your account.








