Mission and Identity

As the year rushes to an end we are taking time in our RE lessons to prepare our students for the great season of Christmas, that is just around the corner.

We have been focusing a lot on the season of Advent, which precedes Christmas. During Advent, we are waiting and preparing for the coming of the newborn king. We have looked at the family tree of Jesus, the Jesse Tree, which depicts all the main characters

from the Old Testament that are the lineage of Jesus and his link to humankind. On the tree, you can find the symbols of Adam & Eve, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Moses, Jacob, Joseph, Ruth and many more. We also have talked about the prophets who foretold of the coming of Jesus many hundreds of years before his birth.



Well then, the Lord himself will give you a sign: a young woman who is pregnant will have a son and will name him 'Emmanuel.' Isaiah 7:14. Emmanuel means 'God is with us'.



The Advent wreaths are being set up in our classroom prayer spaces. The Advent wreath is a circle of evergreens (branches, leaves or vines). The evergreens stand for life. The circle has no start or finish. It stands for God's eternal presence in our lives. On the branches of the wreath are four candles, one for each week of Advent.

Three candles are purple. One candle is pink. In the centre of the wreath, there is a white candle. The candles remind us that Jesus is the light of the world. They tell us that Jesus is coming soon.

As we light, a candle each week we pray and reflect upon the four themes of Advent. Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. This year Advent commences on **Sunday 1st December**.

As well as being the start of Advent, the Diocese of Broken Bay will celebrate the Mass of Inclusion on this date, celebrating people with disability and welcoming them into our church. The mass will be celebrated on Sunday, 1st December at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Yardley Avenue, Waitara at 9:30 a.m.

Some of our College leaders will be representing St Edmund's at the mass but we would love to see as many of our community at the mass as possible. If anyone is interested in joining the choir for the mass there will be a rehearsal at 8am before the mass on Sunday morning.

French

This week, Year 8 classes culminated their French studies with a visit to 'The Little Snail' French restaurant in Pyrmont. We chose the Little Snail as it is an iconic Sydney restaurant, offers traditional French cuisine and the staff were more than pleased to welcome our students. Throughout this year, students studied a variety of topics covering language and culture. This term the focus topics were 'Going on an Excursion' and 'French food'. Students learned about the many foods originating in France, which are now part of the Australian table, how to request food and social

etiquette in a restaurant.

We rewrote the menu for use in the classroom, adding images to assist students. Students were then able to read the menu, discovered there were three courses, with several choices for each course and then chose their preferred dish. Inside the restaurant, students were able to practise greetings and some were able to order their meals in French. Highly recommended were: les escargots à la bourguignonne, le coq au vin and la mousse au chocolat. We were surprised at how easily many of the students were willing to try unfamiliar dishes. They practised using a knife and fork to cut up food, served drinks (only water and cordial) to their friends and engaged in social discourse about the foods each were eating. Some students even suggested they would like to take their parents to the restaurant. It's the holiday season around the corner, why not try it?




Parent User Guide - Sentral Academic Reports


The Sentral Parent Portal provides online access for parents to a range of information specific to their child including their timetable, attendance records, the College calendar and reporting. This guide outlines the steps needed to access the student reports.

New Users

- 1. Open your browser (e.g. Chrome/ Firefox/Internet Explorer) and go to https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal/register
- 2. Use your email address as a username and fill in the other required details to create your account.




3. You will then see a screen which looks like the one below – wait for your approval email from the school. This may take 24-48 hours.






4. Once you have received the email confirming your registration, use your web browser again and go to https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal Log in using the username and password you created earlier.




5. You will then be prompted to add your child to your account by entering an Access Key. This Access Key was provided in both letters sent to you during this Semester and consists of letters and numbers e.g. JZZ45m22jF. Your child's photo will appear when you have successfully linked your account.






