Principal's Message ...

Dear Parents, Students and Friends of St Edmund's,

St Edmund's College has been proactive in our response to COVID-19 and we have followed all advice received from the Government and NSW Health and our governing authorities. We are in unprecedented times and we will continue to be presented with challenges along the way.

The advice of the Federal Government, NSW Health, our governing body Edmund Rice Education Australia (please see attached letter from EREA) and other agencies continues to be that schools are not to temporarily suspend operation. This is because this would release children more widely into the community where more elderly and at-risk people would be circulating. At the same time, schools are being asked to continue preparing and planning for a temporary suspension of operations from face-toface teaching to off campus learning. The College Executive has been planning for this for some time and is well placed to deliver a style of off campus learning to students. Resources and information are currently being collated, ready for this situation should it occur.

As parents and staff, we also have a responsibility to help our children deal with the significant emotional impact of a situation such as COVID-19. With so much media attention and news coverage, it is easy for anxiety and fear to develop across the community. Deputy Principal's Message ...

Term 1: Our first term continues to move quickly with all our students settled into our various routines and their learning. Even with some changes to work experience and excursions, our students have quickly adapted and are happy with the new opportunities. I thank Ms Jacqui Baxter for the enormous amount of work she has done in rescheduling all our senior programs.

While the media continues to inform us of the COVID-19 updates, we know that our students are aware and becoming very anxious about the current situation. We continue to share social stories with them to help them understand and so bring calm and context to this situation.

Name Labels: A reminder that it is important to label all of your child's items including hats, jumpers/jackets, water bottles and lunch boxes. It is easy for students to leave their items around and without name labels it is difficult for us to return them to their rightful owners.

College Rules: The College rules, which guide our student behaviours and attitudes are:

Be Safe, Be Caring and Be a Good Learner

These highlight out student expectations and continue to motivate our students to be the best they can be here in and outside the classroom. We encourage parents to emphasis these rules at home to create a common language and boundaries for our children.

Year 7/8 Camp: Each year, St Edmund's College holds an annual school camp for all students. Due to the COVID-19 situation we have had to cancel the Camp for next term. We ask however that permission forms are still completed and sent back to allow us to reschedule the Camp later in the year if the current situation changes and there is availability at the venue.

A Reminder about Student illness: As our weather is in constant flux, a general reminder that if your child is not feeling well, has a fever, vomiting or diarrhoea, bad pain or coughing that will not stop, they need to remain home to rest and/or see your doctor.

Here at the College we are encouraging constant use of hygienic practices, especially hand sanitizing for staff and students. Please encourage this at home to promote health and reduce illnesses within our community.

Personalised Plan Meetings: The Personalised Plan meeting bookings remain open until 27th March. Parents are asked to make a booking so that Personalised Plans can be finalised. As bookings are held during the school day please be mindful that each meeting is scheduled for only 45 minutes and teachers may need to attend the lesson in the following period. You are also welcome to have the meeting over the phone; please confirm with your Homeroom teacher what their availability might be.

Mission and Identity

As we journey through our Lenten preparation, we start to focus upon the story of Easter. The last week of Lent is Holy Week. In our Religious Education lessons, we are beginning to look at this story and its key points.

With the Coronavirus concerns possibly leading to students not being at school, I would like to take this opportunity to share this story with you so that you can talk about it with your children when they are at home.

The week begins on Palm Sunday. The day Jesus arrives in Jerusalem riding on a donkey. The crowds all gather and celebrate his entry like a king. They wave palms, something they did as victorious armies returned from battle and laid their cloaks down in the path of the donkey. They all cheered and called out "Hosanna! Hosanna!" as Jesus passed by. Some people were not so happy to see Jesus treated in such a way and they began to plot his downfall.

On Holy Thursday Jesus gathered with his friends and disciples for a special meal. The meal of the Passover. As they gathered in the room, Jesus began by washing their feet. They protested saying he was their master and should not be washing the feet. Jesus responded: 'And now I give you a new commandment:



love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples.' **John 13:34-35.** By washing the apostles' feet Jesus showed them what it means to love one another. He showed them that to love one another they had to be kind and caring. They had to look after one another.



During the supper, Jesus took some bread, gave thanks to God and shared it with his disciples, ... broke it, and gave it to his disciples. 'Take and eat it,' he said; 'this is my body.' Matthew 26:26

The he took the cup of wine, gave thanks and gave it to them saying: 'Drink it, all of you,' he said; 'this is my blood, which seals God's covenant, my blood poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. **Matthew 26:27-28**

After Supper, Jesus took his disciples to the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus knew what was about to happen. He wanted to pray to his Father. While Jesus was praying, an angel appeared. The angel gave him strength.

Judas arrived with a group of soldiers just as Jesus finished praying. Judas told the soldiers that Jesus was the man they wanted. The soldiers arrested Jesus and then he was taken away and put to trial.

During the early morning hours of Good Friday, Jesus faced six trials! At the final trial, Pilate gave in. He sentenced Jesus to die. So the soldiers grabbed Jesus. They stripped him bare and put a purple robe on him. They put a crown of thorns on his head. The soldiers mocked Jesus, spat on him, and led him away to be crucified. Jesus hung on the cross for six hours before he died. When Jesus died the curtain in the temple tore and fell to the ground.


The army officer saw what had happened, and he praised God, saying, 'Certainly he was a good man!' Luke 23:47

After Jesus' body was taken down from the cross, it was wrapped in cloth. Jesus was laid in the tomb. A great stone was rolled across the entrance of the tomb.

Jesus died on the cross to save us. By dying, he forgave our sins. This means that we are able to have a life with God. This gives us hope.

Dear Parents and Care-givers

Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA) considers it important to write to you in light of the intense media scrutiny around the status of school operations during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Following consultation with relevant educational and government authorities and consistent with the position of the National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC), EREA schools will remain open until further notice.

We will continue to work with individual schools where contact with COVID-19 cases are confirmed. This situation may change quickly, but EREA is acting in accord with the current NCEC advice.

We extend heartfelt thanks to each of our Principals for the pro-active, considered and professional leadership that they have displayed in the course of the current crisis. This leadership has allowed schools and schooling to proceed with minimal disruption.
