## Principal's Message ...

It was great to see the return of the students to school this week, bringing a 'wintery bleak' and empty school back to life again after the three-week break. Students are the beating heart of a school and make it an enjoyable privilege to work with and teach - complete with both their challenges and successes.

Relationships: 'Relationships' are one of the St Edmund's College four foundational values, along with Faith, Joy and Community. Given the importance of good relationships between teachers and students, we sometimes stop at that point,

at risk of downplaying the key role of other relationships. The relationship between parents and school can be even more important at times, in ensuring the successful outcomes for students. When a student is doing very well, or manages to deal with a crisis or problem constructively, usually that is the direct result of parents and school working together to make that happen. In contrast, a poor relationship often accompanies poor outcomes for the student. In light of this, I would ask that in the event you are unsure, concerned or just need to seek clarification about an issue, I would ask that you make this known to your child's Homeroom teacher so that these can be worked through constructively and positively in the best interest of your child.

**Personalised Planning Meetings:** Two evenings have been set aside to undertake Personalised Planning Meetings – Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> August. Information will be sent out to families shortly. Given the recent escalation of COVID-19 cases in Victoria and also locally, the advice from Catholic Schools NSW is that parent meetings should be conducted online where possible. Given this advice, we will be conducting Personalised Planning Meetings either online or over the phone. Further information about online details will be sent home to parents in the coming weeks. Thank you for your understanding and support with these changes as we ensure that we comply with these requirements.



## Deputy Principal's Message ...

Welcome back to Term 3 Semester 2! At the heart of our Edmund Rice community are our College rules which reflect in a very practical way our Touchstones of Gospel Spirituality; Liberating Education; Inclusive Community and Justice & Solidarity.

These rules guide our students' behaviours and attitudes and are:

These highlight out student expectations and continue to motivate our students to be the best they can be in and outside the classroom. We encourage parents to emphasis these rules at home to create a common language and boundaries for our children.

**Communication:** As we begin the new term, a reminder that the process for contacting your child while at school is through the College Administration Office. Students hand in to the Office their phones or Smart watches (those with a sim card) so that they are not a distraction from learning or social interactions. Students cannot access external emails either. Thank you for supporting us with this process.

**Student illness:** As we continue to live through this health crisis, a reminder that if your child is not feeling well, has a fever, vomiting or diarrhea, bad pain or coughing that will not stop, they need to remain at home to rest and/or see your doctor and possibly have a COVID-19 test.

Here at the College we are encouraging constant use of hygienic practices, especially hand sanitizing for staff and students. Please ensure that this is also encouraged at home to promote health and reduce illnesses within our community.

**Personalised Planning Meetings:** The Personalised Planning Meeting bookings are now open for Semester 2. Parents are ask to **make a booking by the end of week 4** so that Personalised Plans can be finalised.

These sessions will be held on Tuesday 18th and 25th August from 1.25 p.m. to 7.00 p.m. Meetings are for 40 minutes and will be conducted via ZOOM or phone calls due to social distancing regulations.

Once you have made an online booking, your Homeroom teacher will email you an invitation for a ZOOM meeting. If this is not possible your Homeroom teacher will organise a phone meeting.

Each Semester your Homeroom teacher will work with you to prepare a number of SMART goals. These goals will inform the teaching, learning and wellbeing approaches for your child throughout the semester. Once finalised, the completed Personalised Plan will be provided to all parents for signing. If you are having trouble with booking meetings through EDVAL please contact me here at the College.

**College Assemblies:** During this term our Assembly will, once again, be recorded and shared into individual Homeroom classes. This supports our social distancing as guided by NSW Health at this time. Unfortunately, parents and friends are not able to be present at Assemblies at the moment, however they will be recorded and shared with our families via Class Dojo.

## Mission and Identity

As we begin another very busy school term, I would like to take the time to reflect upon the gospel story of Martha and Mary.

As Jesus and the disciples continued on their way to Jerusalem, they came to a certain village where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. Her sister, Mary, sat at the Lord's feet, listening to what he taught but Martha was distracted by the big dinner she was preparing. She came to Jesus and said, "Lord, doesn't it seem unfair to you that my sister just sits here while I do all the work? Tell her to come and help me." But the Lord said to her, "My dear Martha, you are worried

and upset over all these details! There is only one thing worth being concerned about. Mary has discovered it and it will not be taken away from her." <u>Luke 10:38-42</u> (NLT)

The Gospel paints Mary in a discomfiting, even scandalous posture, sitting at the feet of Jesus. In these Jewish times, no self-respecting woman would sit a man's feet. However, Jesus treats her as a disciple, equal in status to any of the male disciples that follow him.

In contrast to Mary, Martha is very practical and result orientated. She represents the typical overworked person who has little time left over for introspection or personal leisure. Jesus invites Martha to be more like her sister and listen to him speak.

In these unusual times, when being bombarded with so much bad news and world wide troubles, do we take time out to stop and be with our Lord? Do we listen for his words? Do we allow ourselves to sit at the feet of our Divine Master like Mary?

I would like to share with you a prayer relating to this story:

### A Prayer for a Mary Heart in a Martha World


Dear Lord Jesus, first of all, thank you for being so welcoming and desirous of our fellowship. Not only do we have access to your throne of grace 24/7, it's **you** who greets us there. We're never a bother, are never "put on hold," never have to "take a number and wait." We'll never meet a tired and frustrated you, **Hallelujah**, we cry, many times over.

**We're** the ones who get tired and frustrated. We live in a "Martha" world of many distractions, neverending demands and over-stimulation. Lord Jesus, help us - **help me** cultivate a Mary heart in a Martha world. My problem isn't the world I inhabit, but the heart that inhabits me. I make King David's prayer mine, "Give me an undivided heart that I may live in awe of your name", Jesus (<u>Ps. 86:11</u>). **You** are the "one thing worth being concerned about"; **you** are the "one thing" that will never be taken from us.
