#### Short Reflection on Women and Prayer ...

They are moved by the plight of others and pray for relief and for justice.

They pray over the big issues – war and famine and disaster – and over the small things of everyday life. In poor communities, women pray. They pray for food for hungry children, for water that won't make them sick, for schools so their children can learn – their sons and their daughters.

They pray that the rice harvest will be bountiful, the cow will give birth safely, their husband will find work today so there will be a meal this evening.

They pray for safety, from bombs, from violence and from disaster.

Please remember to send along a gold coin with your child in their Mufti clothes - you can add in some crazy socks if you have them! Next Tuesday: it is for a very worthy cause.

#### **Educational App of the Week - eplatform by Wheelers Books**

The College has a subscription for all students to access ebooks and audio books online. They can access these books though a variety of devices. I encourage you to use this subscription at home, perhaps in the upcoming holiday break!

#### What devices can you use ePlatform on?

Apple devices (e.g. iPhone, iPad or iPod Touch (requires iOS7 or higher))

Download the app from Apple App Store.

**Android devices** (e.g. Galaxy Tab, Galaxy S, Galaxy Note, HTC devices)

Download the app from Google Play.

Windows tablets (NOT Windows phones)

Download the app from Windows store.

**Desktop or laptop** (PC or Mac)

Read via your browser or download reader software and create an Adobe ID. See our <u>guide to setting</u> <u>this up</u>.

#### Kobo eReader, Sony eReader or Nook eReader

Download Adobe Digital Editions and create an Adobe ID. See our guide to setting this up.

#### How do you read eBooks or listen to Audiobooks?

The simplest way to read eBooks or listen to audiobooks is to access the free ePlatform app. Through this app you can easily find your library (Edmund Rice Special Education Services), then access all your titles and read or listen to them via the browser – even if offline, all via your tablet or smartphone. The app can be accessed on an iPad, iPhone, Galaxy and most other devices:

- 1. Download the ePlatform app from the Apple, Google Play or Windows app stores;
- 2. Look for the Edmund Rice Special Education Services library and log in you'll only need to do this once:
- 3. Search for, borrow and read or listen to any book you want!

For more information on the app and where to download it from <u>read this app information</u>. Both the ePlatform app and website allow eBooks to be read via the browser. This means users can read either online or offline and have access to a full range of display settings so they can customize their reading experience to match their preferences. For more on this see our <u>browser reader information</u>. Audiobooks can be accessed just like the eBooks, but for offline listening, you will have to download the title first. To download an Audiobook you only need the ePlatform app - no extra software is required. After that you can listen to your Audiobook anywhere and anytime. 


# Parent User Guide - Sentral Academic Reports


The Sentral Parent Portal provides online access for parents to a range of information specific to their child including their timetable, attendance records, the College calendar and reporting. This guide outlines the steps needed to access the student reports.

## **New Users**

- 1. Open your browser (e.g. Chrome/ Firefox/Internet Explorer) and go to <a href="https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal/register">https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal/register</a>
- 2. Use your email address as a username and fill in the other required details to create your account.




3. You will then see a screen which looks like the one below – wait for your approval email from the school. This may take 24-48 hours.






4. Once you have received the email confirming your registration, use your web browser again and go to <a href="https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal">https://sentral.erses.nsw.edu.au/portal</a> Log in using the username and password you created earlier.




5. You will then be prompted to add your child to your account by entering an Access Key. This Access Key was provided in both letters sent to you during this Semester and consists of letters and numbers e.g. JZZ45m22jF. Your child's photo will appear when you have successfully linked your account.







 Once you click on 'Semester 1, 2018', a PDF file will open and you will be able to view the report.




