Deputy Principal's Message

We are very much looking forward to all of our students returning to the College next week (Week 4).

I have also distributed a social story/forewarning which may be useful for supporting your child's return via Class Dojo and by email.

A few reminders below to ensure a smooth return:

- Students should return to school in their summer uniform or sports uniform on P.E./sports days.
- Homeroom teachers will provide timetables to advise which days sport/P.E. is scheduled for.
- If your child is on transport, please remember to notify your driver for pick up.
- Parent pick up remains the same please wait on the grassed area inside the front gate.
- Please return all iPads fully charged (as your child will require these on the first day they are back) as well as chargers and cables. The iPad chargers are very expensive to replace and we would appreciate the return of these items.

Keeping sun safe is also very important and students must bring their hats/caps each day please.

A Reminder about Student illness:

As NSW Health provides our mandated process around COVID-19, a reminder that if your child is not feeling well, has a mild fever, running nose, vomiting or diarrhea, bad pain or coughing, they need to remain at home to rest and/or see your doctor. NSW Health now requires your child to have a COVID test prior to returning to school. Please ensure the negative result of your child's test accompanies your child's return to school for our records.

Here at the College we are continuing our hygienic practices, especially hand sanitising for staff and students. Please also encourage this practice at home to promote health and reduce illnesses within our community.

I am pleased to announce that Mr Michael Farrell has been appointed to the position of Principal of Edmund Rice Special Education Services, effective from the commencement of the 2022 school year.

He is currently the Deputy Principal – Head of Secondary at The McDonald College, North Strathfield. Michael complements his leadership experience with a sound academic record with a Master of Leadership and Management in Education from the University of New England and a Bachelor of Education and Diploma of Education from Australian Catholic University. He is also the recipient of the NSW Premier's Award for Quality Teaching. Michael has a long connection with St Bernard's Parish in Berowra Heights and comes highly recommended for this important leadership position.

Michael writes about his appointment:
