Principal's Message ...

We recently paused to solemnly recognise National Reconciliation Week (NRW). NRW is an important moment for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. To coincide with NRW, Edmund Rice Education Australia launched our renewed commitment to Reconciliation through our Stretch Reconciliation Action Plan (Stretch RAP). We should be very proud that Edmund Rice Education

Australia continues to walk in solidarity with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. EREA is committed to providing an inclusive, welcoming and sustaining environment and a culturally enriching education for all children and young people. EREA values the wisdom and experiences of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and aspires to deepening an understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Knowings throughout the curriculum, the cultural life and leadership of EREA schools. Below is a message from our Executive Director, Dr Craig Wattam, taken from the Stretch RAP. I have provided a link to the Stretch RAP below and I recommend it to you to gain a full understanding of EREA's commitment to reconciliation and learning.

Message from the Executive Director, Dr Craig Wattam

On National Sorry Day in 2022, we acknowledged the fifth anniversary of the Uluru Statement from the Heart, in which First Nations Peoples, "coming from all points of the southern sky", extended the invitation: "walk with us in a movement of the Australian people for a better future." As members of Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA), we have publicly endorsed the Uluru Statement as a sign of our commitment to act for reconciliation and to provide a liberating education for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, and non-Indigenous children and young people, in our early learning services and schools.

Our Commitment to Reconciliation and Learning

We have committed to reconciliation, noting that the "Reconciliation movement in Australia is at a tipping point, and that we as a nation need to move from a space of 'safe' to 'brave' on issues affecting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples."1 EREA's Stretch RAP seeks to further embed reconciliation initiatives in our organisational culture. The Stretch RAP has been developed at the same time as our new EREA Learning Statement "Implementing Liberating Practice to Co-create a Better World". The key deliverable of this statement is "to explicitly co- creating the learning conditions, dispositions and relationships to enable deep listening, confidence, agency and freedom".

Furthering our commitment to Reconciliation through a Stretch RAP

In advancing the five dimensions of reconciliation - Race Relations, Equality and Equity, Institutional Integrity, Historical Acceptance and Unity - EREA wishes to provide strong leadership in promoting respectful relationships and creating meaningful opportunities with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. The EREA National Stretch RAP will provide guidance and momentum for each EREA school to integrate and embed the values and priorities of the reconciliation movement into the fabric of their school cultures - their daily ways of being, knowing and doing. In creating a Stretch RAP, our commitment to reconciliation is further extended. We will continue to review and expand the embedding of reconciliation principles in all domains of Governance within our organisation, to ensure that we identify and provide opportunities, remove barriers to inclusion and listen respectfully to the voices of First Nations Australians. Our Actions for reconciliation will ensure that First Nations ways of Knowing, Doing and Being are recognised, valued and represented in the fabric of our organisational structures and leadership development, and in all facets of daily life in our school communities. Finally, on our reconciliation journey, we commit to continual cycles of learning, unlearning and relearning, to improve the cultural competency of all non- Indigenous employees, so that we become proactive in our pursuit of justice, healing and restoration, in order to create a shared identity as Australians which reflects the best of all of us, as we ensure that past wrongdoings are never repeated.



Assembly Awards

Congratulations to the following students who received Sports Awards at this morning's Assembly:

NSW All-Schools Swimming Championships

Ben P and Isaac who were selected into the NSWCCC Team. The boys competed in the NSW All-Schools Swimming Championships on 3rd June. Isaac represented NSWCCC in the 50m backstroke and finished the event with a personal best time. Ben represented NSWCCC in 50m freestyle, 50m breaststroke, 50m butterfly, 50m backstroke, 100m freestyle and competed as a member of the NSWCCC Relay Team. Ben also qualified for Nationals in 50m freestyle (3rd place), 50m Butterfly (3rd place) and placed 2nd, as a member of the NSWCCC Relay Team. He will be travelling to Brisbane Aquatic Centre in Queensland to compete in the National School Swimming Championships in August (15th-20th).

Broken Bay Cross Country Championships

The BBSSSA Cross Country Championships were held at St Ives Showground on 9th May. St Edmund's College took 17 representatives to compete on the day. The weather was not ideal, however all our students competed extremely well and displayed perseverance, determination and consistent effort throughout the 3km run. The BBSSSA Cross Country Multi class results are outlined below:

Lucy, Isabella and Sophia were placed in the top 6 athletes to complete the female multi-class event, with Lucy finishing in 3rd place. In the school teams event, Lucy was the first female athlete to finish from our school.

Ben P, Will, Zane, Johann and Bradley were placed in the top 6 athletes to complete the male multiclass event. In the school teams event Ben P finished in 1st place, Will in 2nd place and Zane in 3rd place.

NSWCCC Cross Country Championships

Congratulations to Ben P, Will, Zane, Johann and Bradley for gaining selection into the Broken Bay Cross Country Team. These students competed in the NSWCCC Cross Country Championships at Sydney Motorsport Park, Eastern Creek on Tuesday 7th June.







Eddie's Fresh Food Reopening!

On Tuesday 31st May, St Edmund's College relaunched their Eddie's Fresh Food store in collaboration with Woolworths and Fujitsu. This has been a long- standing relationship between the corporates and the College with St Edmund's College being the first of its kind in the country for the groups.

The mini store was originally opened at St Edmund's College back in 2018 and was the first for Woolworths; now there are another eight mini Woolworths stores across the country. The mini Woolworths store will allow for learning in line with the College's curriculum, assisting subjects such as Maths, English, Food Technology, Hospitality and Retail.
