## Principal's Message ...

**Dear Parents** 

I would like to provide you with an update on a few things.

Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA) is changing its Governance Structure. The new Entity will come into effect on the 1st January 2023. It's called the Regeneration Project. EREA is undertaking a significant and bold change to move the organisation forward and to build confidence in EREA's governance. The change will regenerate its reputation as schools underpinned by strong Edmund Rice values, with a vibrant and inclusive culture that holds the highest standards of Child Safety and wellbeing at its core.

#### The Regeneration Objectives are:

- Delivering safe, student-centred learning inspired by the charism of Blessed Edmund Rice
- Developing culture to best serve our students and young people and to live the charism of Blessed Edmund Rice.
- Ensuring that our leaders are clear about their relationships, responsibilities and accountabilities
- Building trust and confidence within ourselves, our schools and our broader community

Philomena Billington, the President of EREA Council reminds us that -

"Whilst we are deeply engaged in the Regeneration of the governance of EREA, it is timely to remind ourselves that this 'Change of EREA' is focused on providing to students and their families a Liberating Education based on Gospel Spirituality within an Inclusive Community committed to Justice and Solidarity ensuring safety, wellbeing, and optimal learning opportunities."

EREA has undertaken considerable planning to arrive at this point and we are ready and look forward to the positive outcomes the change will bring.

#### Wellbeing



Frank Baum was a newspaperman who put his writing talents to use in a series of children's books about a fairyland called the Land of Oz. His characters had wonderful adventures. Frank later adapted his book into a musical. Twenty years after his death, a musical film called "The Wonderful Wizard of Oz" had its opening on the 18<sup>th</sup> August in 1939.

In the story there are four unhappy characters: - a scarecrow who thinks he has no brain; - a tin woodsman who thinks he has no heart; - a lion who thinks he has no courage, - and a girl called Dorothy who thinks she has no power to change anything in her life. These four characters - all thinking little of themselves - believe that if they reach the Wizard of Oz he will change them so that they have the qualities and talents they would like.

What they discover is that the Wizard doesn't force people to change; instead he cares about them. He sends each of them an invitation to see in themselves what they had not seen before. And so, the scarecrow discovers that he already does have a brain. The tin woodsman realises that he does already have a heart. The lion possesses all he needs to be courageous. Dorothy has what it takes to change things in her own life.

When Dorothy returns to Kansas (from where she had been taken by a tornado) she says to her aunt: "Oh, Aunt Em, I've been to many strange and marvellous places, looking for something that was right here all along... right in my own back yard!"

We are all unique and special, and it is important for our own self-care and self-compassion to discover in ourselves the treasures that we have within. As we learn of these, may we continue to develop them and put them to good use.

May it be that we see in others, their gifts, so that we can nurture them and encourage them to be fulfilled, and live in a way that brings for them a greater sense of the person they are. It is in treating others with respect, care and understanding that we promote the significance of goodness and happiness in our lives and the lives of others – which enhances everyone's wellbeing.

Jesus helped us to learn the importance of treating others in the way we would want to be treated ourselves. So, may we all bring out the best in one another and grow in the way we truly look at ourselves, and the way we truly look at others.





## A Message from our Nurse

This week is National Stroke Recognition Week. In a small annual survey from the Stroke Foundation (5400 people)— 40% of people could not recognise one sign of a Stroke. While you may think a stroke is something that happens to elderly people it can happen to people of all ages. A stroke is a medical emergency, and you call 000 in the same way you would for any other emergency, but because a stroke happens inside a person's head it is sometimes not as obvious. The acronym **F.A.S.T** is used to recognise a stroke (has their

**F**ACE drooped, can they lift both **A**RMS, is their **S**PEECH slurred and can they understand you and **T**IME – call 000). All is explained in this clip:


