PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

EREA Supports the Voice to Parliament

Dear Parents.

In November 2022, EREA endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart, stating: "We stand in solidarity, alongside our First Nations peoples, in their calls for a Voice and acknowledgment enshrined in the Australian Constitution...

The establishment of a First Nations Voice to Parliament enshrined in the Constitution, and the establishment of a Makarrata Commission for the purpose of truth-telling is at the centre of this justice. We support this road to Treaty." EREA Endorses Uluru Statement of the Heart - Edmund Rice Education Australia.



Our school communities and those in the wider community are engaging in thought about the upcoming referendum on the Voice to Parliament. Edmund Rice Education has a genuine desire to provide learning opportunities for staff and young people about this important decision facing the nation – a conversation that is consistent with an EREA approach of respect, deep listening, dialogue and solidarity.

Within the EREA Acknowledgment of Country, we accept: "the invitation contained in the Uluru Statement From The Heart to listen to the First Peoples of Australia and work together for reconciliation, justice, equity, and healing." The Voice to Parliament is an authentic outcome of this invitation which will have a deep and lasting impact on the future of First Nations peoples within Australia and the reconciliation of this nation.

In living out the commitment to justice and solidarity (The Charter for Catholic Schools in the Edmund Rice Tradition), to Truth Telling (Stretch RAP Respect Action 10) and to deep listening (EREA Learning Statement), EREA supports and encourages all our school communities to continue their reconciliation learning journey, including what a Voice to Parliament could look like and the possible impacts that could be felt by Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people as a result of having an enshrined voice.

Australians have a unique opportunity to vote on a proposed amendment to the Constitution that recognises Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Peoples of this country. This recognition will be seen through the establishment of a Voice which will be an independent, representative body for First Nations peoples speaking on behalf of issues affecting Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people. I encourage our school communities to explore the specific and accurate details regarding this democratic process through the <u>Australian Government website</u>.

EREA stands in solidarity with like-minded organisations including: the National Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC), Reconciliation Australia, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC), Catholic Social Services Australia (CSSA), Caritas and the Edmund Rice Centre. All of these bodies have commenced a process of positive dialogue within their organisations.

The link to our <u>EREA Endorsed Uluru Statement of the Heart - Edmund Rice Education Australia</u> is found within and I encourage our community to consider our commitment to the Statement of the Heart, together with other opportunities for dialogue and messages of support towards the Voice for Parliament.








WELLBEING

50m Breaststroke: 9th


6 x 50m Freestyle Relay: 2nd – silver medal








I started working at St Edmund's in 2009 as a teacher's aide. Part of my role was capturing the day to day life of the college in photographs.

I left in 2018 to pursue other interests. This continued until early 2020. Due to the pandemic, my employment status changed, and I returned to studying, completing a Certificate IV in Photography in 2020 and a Diploma of Photography in 2021 at Ultimo TAFE.

A personal loss in early 2021 led to my own experiences with adverse mental health. It was whilst navigating this I came to understand the true value of connection to community in supporting someone at this time. My return to St Edmund's in 2021 as a casual and the support and understanding I have received from this community has been instrumental in my own healing.

This exhibition sets out to show the reality behind the words and the façade, and how simply walking beside someone can change how they feel.

DISABILITY PENSION

- Your child may be eligible for the disability pension once they are 15 yrs and 9 mths old.

GOLD OPAL CARD

- If your child receives the disability pension, they may be eligible for a gold opal card
- This card allows for travel on public transport for no more than \$2.50 a day
- Go to https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/tr ansaction/apply-for-a-goldsenior-pensioner-opal-card to see if they are eligible

COMPANION CARD

- Your child may be eligible for a Companion Card
- The Companion Card allows a cardholder's support person free entry into participating venues and events.

ELECTORAL COMMISSION

- When your child turns 16 they can enol to vote.
- They cannot vote until they are 18.

- When your child turns 16 they can apply for a NSW Photo Card.
- This will help give; proof of age, proof of identity and proof of address.
