I started working at St Edmund's in 2009 as a teacher's aide. Part of my role was capturing the day to day life of the college in photographs. I left in 2018 to pursue other interests. This continued until early 2020. Due to the pandemic, my employment status changed, and I returned to studying, completing

a Certificate IV in Photography in 2020 and a Diploma of Photography in 2021 at Ultimo TAFE.

A personal loss in early 2021 led to my own experiences with adverse mental health. It was whilst navigating this I came to understand the true value of connection to community in supporting someone at this time. My return to St Edmund's in 2021 as a casual and the support and understanding I have received from this community has been instrumental in my own healing.

This exhibition sets out to show the reality behind the words and the façade, and how simply walking beside someone can change how they feel.
