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In Memory of Pope Francis

As was expressed via an email to families during the holidays, as a Catholic faith community, we mourn the recent death of Pope Francis. To learn of his passing during a time of religious significance such as Easter, brings forth the associated Seasonal themes of light and life and hope, all the more. Pope Francis was someone who consistently demonstrated humility, love, justice and hope throughout his pontificate. One act of service he regularly engaged with at this time of year, was the washing of feet. He broke from tradition by including women, as well as inmates. Once he washed the feet of 12 women prisoners.



Additionally, he became known as the Pope who travelled in a Ford Focus, rather than the available limousine. He saw in each human being God's grace, no matter their status nor background, and he regularly implored world leaders to bring about peace and end conflicts. Pope Francis was a tireless advocate for the poor, and a relentless voice for the marginalised.

In his final speech on Easter Sunday, he shared that 'there can be no peace without freedom of religion, freedom of thought, freedom of expression and respect for the views of others'. When we consider the legacy that Pope Francis leaves behind, there is direct correlation to our own Four EREA Touchstones. He lived Gospel Spirituality in a humble, authentic way.

He encouraged Liberating Education through the wisdom shared in his many writings.

He advocated for a Church and world that embodied an Inclusive Community.

He was a living example of Justice and Solidarity.

May we pray that Pope Francis will rest in peace, and that his teachings, insights and leadership will continue to be adopted within the Catholic Church's mission as we look with light, life and hope for a new Pope who continues to lead our Catholic faith community, with love for all at their core.

Return to School for Term 2

Firstly allow me to commend all students and thank parents and guardians on the generally high standard of students' uniform and application to learning demonstrated by all our students this term. Term 2 is a relatively short term with the following events ensuring that there will be plenty for us to focus on in both learning and supporting the vibrant culture and positive spirit of St Edmunds.

ANZAC Commemorative Service

The opportunity to educate our students on the proud history of those who have selflessly served our country both in War and Peace is one the College takes seriously. We were proudly represented by College Student leaders in school Captain Arpita and Year 12 representative Lauren at the Wahroonga Memorial Service on ANZAC Day. Former MP Paul Fletcher, as well as Local Councillors present, all commended St Edmund's representatives on their presence even in the holidays! Our College Service was held Friday 2 May, with thanks to Mrs Pace, and featured our students learning accounts of the tragic effects of War on Australia's small population, 110 years after the Gallipoli Campaign.

Our guest of honour was Lt Col (ret'd) Dr Rodger Shanahan former Australian Military Attache to the Middle East and currently a Lowy Institute expert on Middle Eastern Affairs and former EREA student.

St Edmund's students planted a Pinus Halepensis, Aleppo "Lone Pine" in our commemorative garden as well as gifting sister plants to Brigidine, St Pius, St Lucy's, OLGFC Forestville, McCarthy College Tamworth, St Gabriel's, St Paul's Manly and The Brother's Retreat Centre at Mulgoa which we can watch grow over the coming years as a sign of respect and solidarity with all those who left to fight for Australia including local residents such as Lt Col Alan Scott DSO a hero the battle of Lone Pine KIA 1/10/1917 at Polygon Wood. His brothers Lt Lee Scott MC and Major John Scott DSO of Wahroonga, and their 16 year old signaller Kevin McCarthy from St Ives (my grandfather).

During the mid-term break I was able to visit some service providers to gain a deeper understanding of their offerings. I was also able to send out invites to around 40 service providers for our Disability and Post-School Expo which is coming up on 10 June. Please pop this date in your diary- it's shaping up to be a great event with a wide range of supports attending.



I am very excited to have been invited to attend Customised Employment Training which starts next week and runs for 40 hours across 5 weeks. I will be eagerly learning from experts in Customised Employment from Marc Gold and Associates and Resourcing Inclusive Communities, and will incorporate my learnings into resources and workshops for families at Eddie's. The Family Engagement theme for Term 2 is Post-School Planning, and we are starting off with an onsite presentation at school next week all about Post-School Transition Planning. This will be held from 6-8pm on Tuesday 6 May – [please RSVP here](#) so that I can confirm the best location for our meeting, as well as some light catering: I will continue to advise families about upcoming events via email and Class Dojo, but here are a few to note first:

- Tuesday 6 May, 6-8pm: **Family Engagement Session at school:** Post School Transition Planning presentation
- **Northern Sydney Post-School Expo:** This is an event where you can meet lots of service providers, ask lots of questions, grab some flyers and maybe even request a trial day in their service.
