Mental Health Awareness Day

Following the recent national focus on mental health throughout the month of October, Ms Cox and the Year 11 students have created an educational video to help raise awareness for the students of St Edmund's regarding this important topic. All students are invited to wear blue mufti clothes next Tuesday 29 November, in solidarity with the meaning behind this video. All students and staff will view the film on Tuesday morning. Thank you to Ms Cox and our talented students for this inspiring initiative.

Parent information session: Nick Kenny, KYDS: A big thank you to Nick, who we have partnered with to provide parent/carer information sessions regarding mental health. This first session took place a few weeks ago and focussed on the topic: Mental Wealth: From Surviving to Thriving. Nick described Mental Wealth as an abundance of the mind: a mind that is healthy and provides positive impact on one's wellbeing. He said that, as humans, we are wired to look for the negatives due to our flight, fight or fright response when facing a confronting, compromising or challenging situation. However, as humans, we also have the capacity to re-wire and re-train our brain thanks to its neurological elasticity. So, the capacity to view situations more positively, to become more self-aware of our own emotional triggers and to adopt healthy strategies to support our need for emotional regulation, is always present. Nick said that positive, healthy connections are key for all humans, and he shared three important factors that build one's mental wealth in this space – mind (connect with yourself), mates (connect with others) and meaning (connect with the positives).

We look forward to arranging more talks from our friends at KYDS throughout next year, and we hope you will find benefit in attending them.


