

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

I extend a very warm welcome to you all for our 2025 school year, here at St Edmund's. We are very excited to have our students join us in recent days, in particular those who are new to the College. Today's assembly allowed for us to acknowledge and celebrate the many new faces who now belong to our community, whether they be staff or students. We know that our community will continue to be enriched by their presence, and the many gifts and talents they have to offer.



In the Catholic Church, 2025 is recognised as a Year of Jubilee. This year's theme is 'Pilgrims of Hope'. Terry O'Keefe, our Coordinator of Mission and

Identity, shared with staff the significance of this theme and how it may be lived throughout the year. How one's pilgrimage of hope looks, can indeed be a personal endeavour, but it is also one that can be made in connection with others. It is an invitation to take a journey inward, of introspection, so as to examine and evaluate the way we engage with the workings of the Holy Spirit in our day to day lives. As a community, may we use this year to guide us in a collective journey of hope – one where we set goals and intentions for ourselves, but also those which we can achieve together. Hope is a beautiful desire to seek and uphold – it is an optimistic state of mind, and one that brings a sense of gratitude, too.

Pope Francis once shared his views on educators, which I feel helps to provide for us all a reminder of the role we play in the lives of our young people. Educators include all who shape the lives of our students, and that includes all St Edmund's staff and you, as parents and carers, as well.

Pope Francis wrote:

"Educators...do not be disheartened in the face of difficulties that the educational challenge presents. Educating is not a profession but a way of being. In order to educate it is necessary to step out of ourselves and be among young people, to accompany them in the stages of their growth and to set ourselves beside them. Give them hope and optimism for their journey in the world. Teach them to see the beauty and goodness of creation. But above all with your life be witnesses of what you communicate. Educators – teachers, parents pass on knowledge and values with their words, but their words will have an incisive effect on children and young people if they are accompanied by their witness, their consistent way of life. Without consistency it is impossible to educate".

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Below is an image of a gate. It helps provide context for the words that will follow beneath it, which help to capture the role we have as educators, the context we find ourselves in as we begin a new school year, and the call we have to be Pilgrims of Hope.



The people of Ancient Rome thought there were many gods, and the month of January is named after 'Janus' who is their god of doors and gateways, of beginnings and endings. In Rome, the temple of Janus had doors facing east and west for the rising and setting of the sun, the beginning and end of each day. Between those doors stood the statue of Janus with two faces, looking in opposite directions.

As we start this New School Year, looking

both backwards and forwards, we can think of the new year as a gate - an opening - to what we choose to do in the future. To take this metaphor further, in the northern hemisphere, the darkness of winter and of past mistakes will give way to the light of spring and of new opportunities.

In the dark days of World War II, with the whole country of England "blacked out" at night to deter enemy bombing, King George VI (the sixth) gave a glimmer of hope to people as he spoke these words:

'I said to the man who stood at the gate of the Year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown'

And he replied: "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light, and safer than a known way. May that almighty hand guide and uphold us all." Let us pray: Lord Jesus, at this time we can look back to the old year, and forward to the new.

We give thanks for the blessings of the past year, and we place into your hands the mistakes we have made.

As you are "the Light of the world", take away the darkness in our lives.

As you are "the Way", lead us in the year ahead.

As you are "the gate of the sheepfold", protect us from danger.

We entrust the past to your mercy, Lord, the present to your love, and the future to your providence.

Sentral Parent Portal

Our portal is an integral tool for collaboration between the College and our parents and carers. This portal can be accessed via a website however is more commonly accessed via the Parent Portal App, which can be downloaded for both Android and Apple devices. Search for 'Sentral for Parents' and look for the icon as attached to this article. The website link for use in a browser is https://stedmunds.sentral.com.au/auth/portal

The Parent Portal can be used to see your child's timetable, College newsletters, reports and to book personalised planning meetings. It is also the **only method** to officially report your child's absence for the purposes of attendance records. I urge all parents to engage with the portal, either via the website or app, to ensure that you are connected so that you can access these items ongoing throughout the academic year.



I have emailed out letters to new families and families still not connected to the portal last Friday for your action. If you have received an email from a sender called 'Sentralmail AT erses.nsw.edu. au' This is the sender which the system automatically generates and is ok to open. You will need to click on the 'register here' hyperlink to make your account once you have opened the app/gone to the website. For new families there will be an access code included within your letter. This access code can be used to 'link' your child to your account after you have registered, upon first log in. Please note that the access key is case sensitive and must be copied exactly as printed in the letter.

Should you experience difficulties please do not hesitate to contact Sean Brannan - Deputy Principal (brannan@stedmunds.nsw.edu.au) for assistance. I will also offer a 'drop in' kiosk during Eddies Big Night In to assist with any other troubleshooting.
